Thank you for showing interest in our Families Helping Families program! We are excited and enthusiastic to see friendships flourish.

We are asking for committed families to enroll in our Families Helping Families program to enable MIA to match refugee families with established families here in Winnipeg. We are requesting that our established families reach out to their matched family and foster friendship with them.

What is expected of you?

Your family makes a commitment of having 2 social interactions per month with the new comer family. What you do is up to both families. Here are some suggestions: visiting the park or city landmarks, play dates, home visits, inviting them for iftar in Ramadan, going together for Jumua or other community events together, Eid visit and gift exchange. These are just some of the wonderful things you can share.

MIA will follow up with you, to see how things are going with your paired family. Remember, we are here for you, should there be any questions or concerns.

Making these connections will help our newcomers feel welcome. Everyone should feel a sense of belonging and you and your family can make this a reality.

Although many of the recent newcomers speak Arabic, they are eagerly learning English and many have expressed sincere interests in having people to practice their English skills with them. We welcome both Arabic and non-Arabic speaking families to enroll in the program.
